Marjo's contribution to tournament water skiing in North Carolina is as a writer. She has written feature-length stories on N.C. skiers for *Water Ski Magazine, The Charlotte Observer, The (Morganton) News Herald*, and community newspapers in Huntersville/Cornelius, Sanford, New London and others. Marjo has also covered water ski pro events, cash prize events and other tournaments for several of those same publications, plus USA Water Ski's publication *The Water Skier*.

Among Carolinas water skiers and events/places she covered for *Water Ski Magazine*, beginning in the 1980s, are feature-length articles on Chuck Forest, Jeff Rodgers, Jonathan McDonald (kneeboarder) and Trophy Lakes.

As a *Charlotte Observer* sports writer beginning in 1986, Marjo wrote features on Walter Gross (sports front centerpiece); Kristi Overton Johnson; April Coble Eller; Karen Truelove Krueger; Tommy Harrington; Jeff Rodgers; Ed and Clay Neill; Don Aschenbrenner; Chelsea Mills; Pam McNairy; Cane Creek Park pro tour stop; Longbranch Lake (S.C.) pro tour stops; Skyview Lake women's pro events; Little Mountain Lakes Queens Cup(s) and more.
